

LINEAR FLOOR DRAIN INSTALLATION INSTRUCTION

NOTE

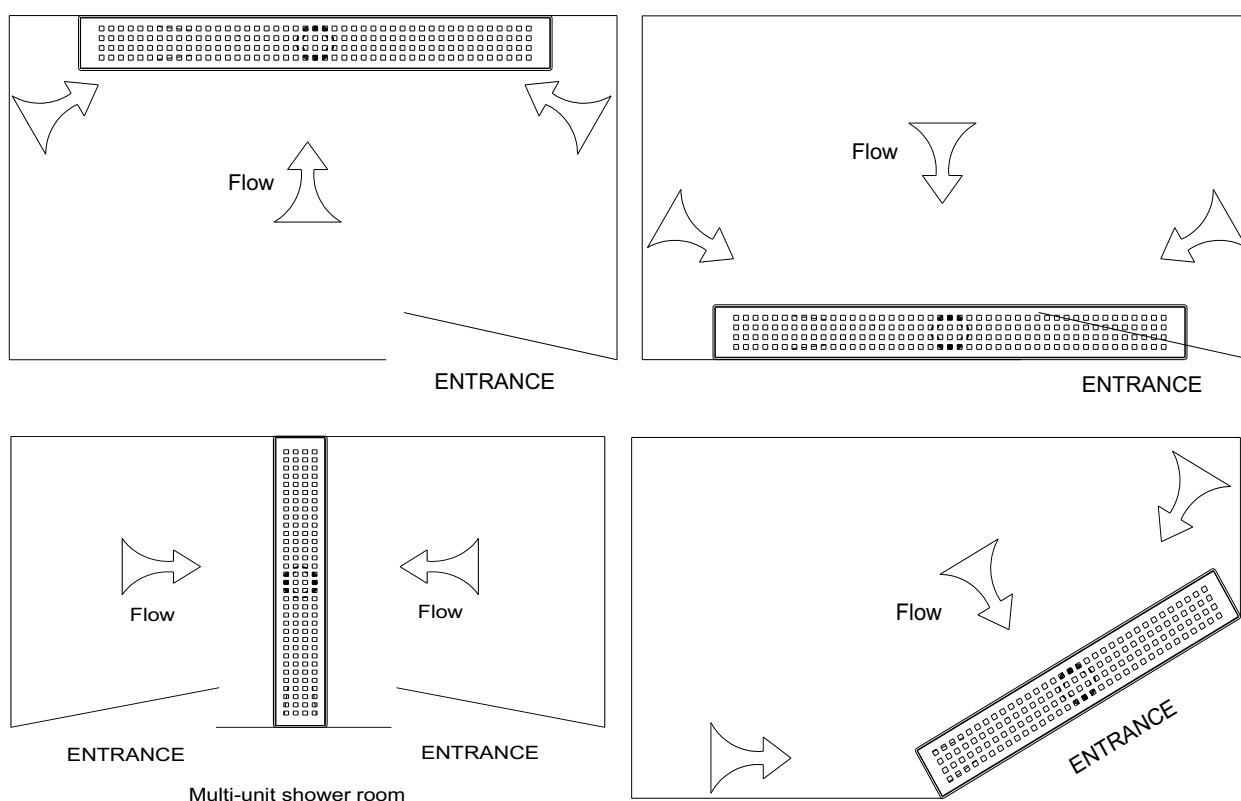
Thoroughly inspect the product and its components before installation. Please report any damaged or missing components to ** for a replacement, return or repair. Your request will be responded to within 2 working days.

The information provided in this instruction guide are general guidelines and a licensed professional should always be present during installation. Consult local building codes to ensure the installation complies with the standards in your area. The warranty will be void if the product is installed with a conspicuous defect.

***Carefully check the parts for the completeness of your received fixture before installation.**

TYPICAL DRAIN PLACEMENT

Whether for a renovation or a new construction, choosing the drain location is contingent on the waste line location, which may be predetermined or already installed. Moving a waste line may be possible, depending on site condition.



PREPARATION

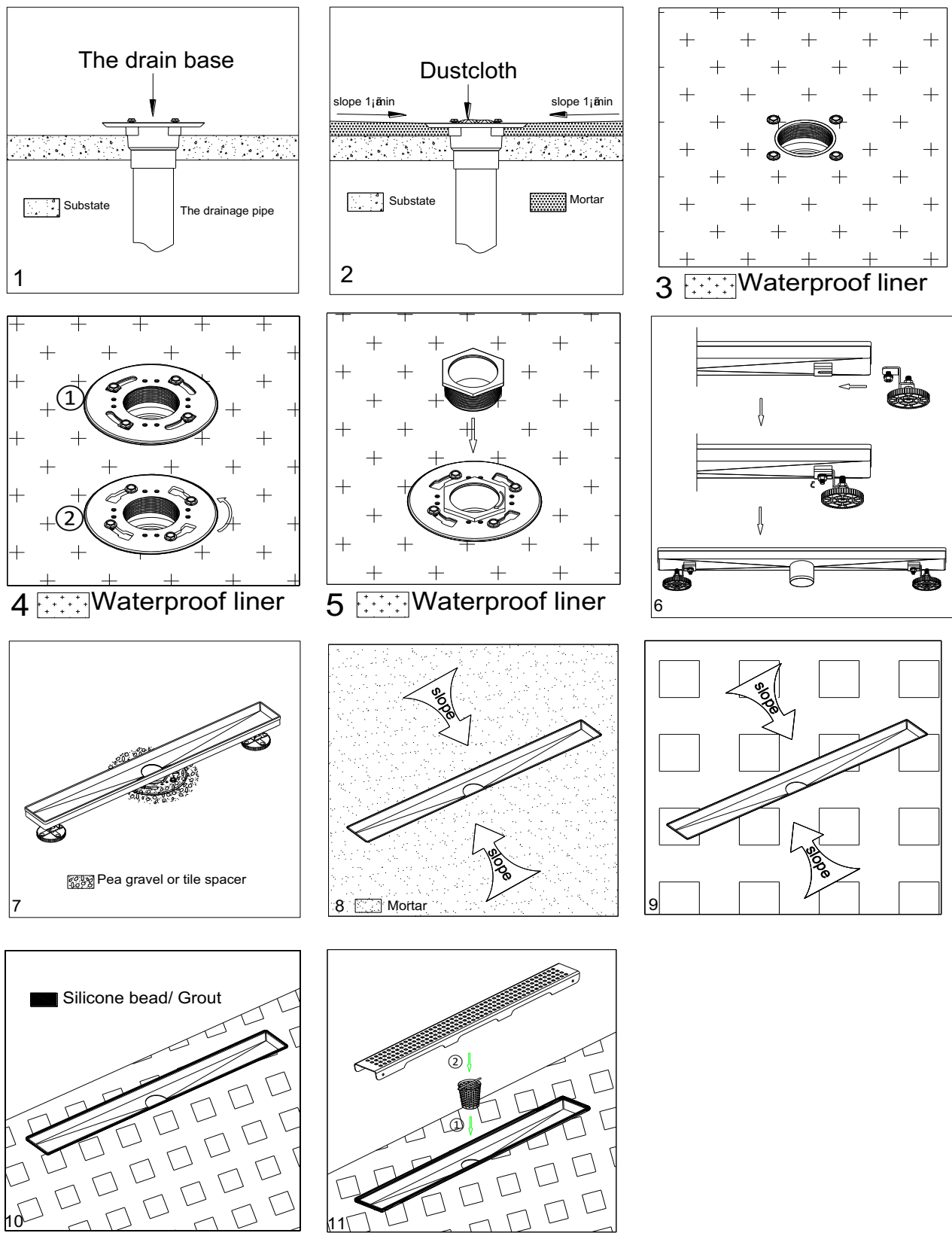
The substrate should be smooth, level, clean and free of all dirt, oil, laitance, paint, concrete sealers or curing compounds. Dry dusty concrete slabs or masonry should be dampened and excess water should also be swept off.

The following tools and materials may be needed: Hole Saw, Crescent wrench, Level, Utility Knife, Ruler or Tape measure, pencil, Notched Trowel, Weep protectors, Silicone, Solvent Cement.

For the traditional type of waterproofing, the professional should build a shower pan in the wet/shower area with PVC, Vinyl, Lead of fiberglass material, then the drain usually connect to the waste line with a mechanical clamp down drain flange (drain base), for models that do not include such a flange it is recommended to purchase one separately before installation.

INSTALLATION STEPS

The following installation details do not cover every possible situation, some may not be appropriate for DIY. Always consult with a licensed professional before installation.



STEP 1. Coupling the drain base outlet to 2" schedule 40 DWV pipe using correct solvent cement.

STEP 2. Blocking the drain opening with a rag, trowel mortar to build shower pan, reinforce around drain base to be flush with the floor, grate to create MIN 1% slope towards the drain.

STEP 3. Remove the rag. Lay the waterproof membrane on whole shower pan and cut a slit for the bolts to poke through, then cut away the waste hole in the center. Bond the membrane around the waste hole with waterproof silicone, the membrane can be glued directly to the surface of the drain base.

STEP 4. Install the coupling plate and fasten the bolts. Perform a leak test before moving to the next step.

STEP 5. Screw the threaded adapter into the drain base.

STEP 6. Adjusting feet are installed on both sides of drain body, and fasten the screws (as shown in picture 6, and do not tighten them overly.)

STEP 7. Push the drain outlet into the threaded adapter hole. Spread pea gravel or tile spacer around the drain base to protect the weep holes.

Adjust drain body by rotating the adjusting feet, the top edge need to be flush with the height of tile surface, then level the drain body (use a tool, for example, a spirit level).

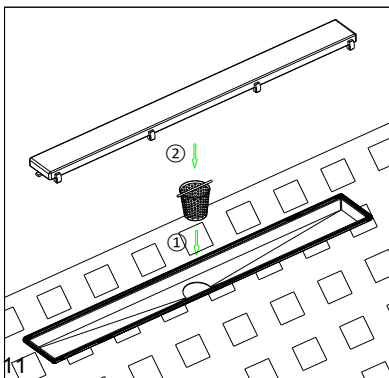
STEP 8. Trowel mortar onto the membrane, build up the shower floor allowing for thickness of tile and adhesive, grade to create MIN 1% slope towards the drain.

STEP 9. After the floor mortar has cured, install the floor tile with tile adhesive or thin set mortar, using a notched trowel.

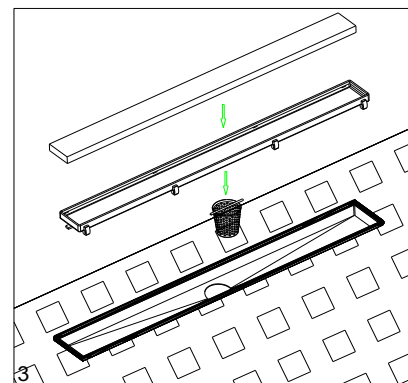
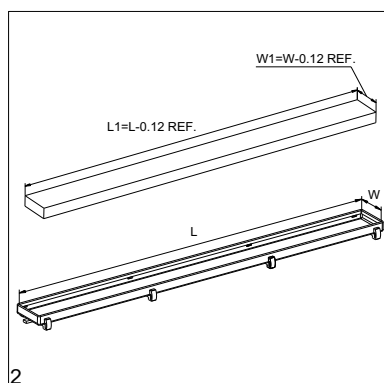
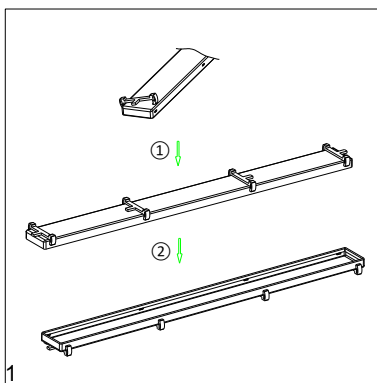
STEP 10. Fill the gap around the drain body with silicone bead or grout, sweep off the excess material.

STEP 11. Put the stainless strainer and grate into the drain body successively.

***If your shower drain type is TYPE II, STEP 11 of installation is as follows.**



And it has another usage---insert-tile. You can try by the following steps:



STEP1. Assemble the supporters under the tray (as shown in picture1), ensure it is seated properly. Then turn the opening frame of the tray upwards for use.

Please pay attention to the installation way of the supporters on both sides of tray in picture 1.

STEP2. Carefully measure the inside opening frame of the tray, cut the insert-tile as required size, maximum tile thickness 14mm. (Figures in picture2 are for reference only.)

STEP3. Put the strainer, tray and the finished tile in the drain body successively.

Note about step3:

- ① Optional: Apply adhesive or silicone on the back and perimeter of tile before laying. If you do, please scrape the excess tile adhesive, clean up the tile surface and the tray after laying.
- ② Tile surface should not be lower than the tray edge to avoid ponding water.

Note: do not use your shower for 48 hours after installation.

CARE & MAINTENANCE

After installation, some aggressive substance such as sealant, adhesive, mortar maybe cause a “yellow spot” on the channel, we recommend using a scour pad to remove such “spot”, and always brushing in the direction of the grain. Periodically clean the fixture with non-abrasive cleaner or soft scrub.

For polished, matte black and oil rubbed bronze finishes, we recommend cleaning with mild soap and soft cloth.

Do not use abrasive cleaners, ammoniated products, rubbing alcohol, detergents, astringents, bleach-based cleaners, aggressive chemicals, abrasive cleaning pad, or harsh polishes on the fixture. The use of such substances may void the warranty.
